Canadian biotechnology star BioChem Pharma Inc. and its multinational partner, Glaxo Canada Inc., have expanded their research relationship into new fields. At the same time, Glaxo has terminated an agreement that restricted the percentage of BioChem it can own. Glaxo is now BioChem's biggest shareholder, with 17 per cent, but a Glaxo spokesperson said it has no plans to increase its share.

The two companies have worked together since BioChem went public in 1987, said Jacques Yves Duthel, vice-president of public affairs for Laval-based BioChem.

Glaxo is handling the clinical development and testing of BioChem's first product, an anti-AIDS compound 3TC, and anti-hepatitis B compound Lamivudine.

The new two-year research agreement will allow the partners to begin concentrating on antiviral compounds for the treatment of herpes and hepatitis C and other illnesses, Duthel said.

"It's a very important agreement for us," he said.

BioChem's researchers do the basic scientific work of identifying compounds. Glaxo then uses its sophisticated labs in Britain or the U.S. to speed up development, Duthel said.

Once promising compounds are discovered they are covered by BioChem's master licensing deal with Glaxo, which has its Canadian headquarters in Mississauga.

- use fewer search terms
- use **OR** to connect terms, e.g.:
 - business AND (first nations OR Indian OR aboriginal)
