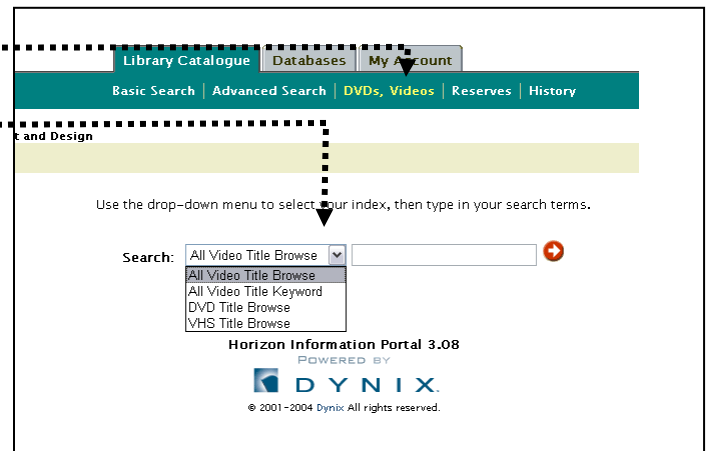

## To Search by Title

1. select DVDs, Videos tab
2. use drop-down menu to select either DVD or Video

### Note:

- for Browse option you need the exact title
- for Keyword searches you can enter any word from the title



3. from the results list, click the title
4. the Catalogue Record will indicate:

- the Call Number
- whether the item is checked in
- whether it is a Circulating item (Note: "Library Use Only" items cannot be signed out)

### Note:

- if an item is out of the Library a **due date** will appear under **status**
- you cannot place a **hold** on an AV item
- **Library Use Only** is for expensive items; in library use prevents you from having to cover replacement costs if they are lost

## To Search by Subjects

1. select Advanced Search
2. pick General Keyword search
3. enter search terms (subjects, directors, actors, **NOTE:** you do not have to use ALL boxes
4. if using more than one search box use **BOOLEAN** operators to connect them
  - AND to limit search results
  - OR to expand search (e.g. **artist\* AND native OR first nation\* OR indian**)
  - NOT to take out a search term (e.g. to search for sculptor Mary Shelley not the author who wrote Frankenstein, try **mary shelley AND sculpt\* NOT frankenstein**)

5. Limit your search to specific material types. To select more than one, hold down **CTRL key** while selecting limits. For DVDs and Videos select:
  - DVD collection (can be signed out of the Library)
  - DVD reference (non-circulating)
  - Video collection or Video reference

## Search Tips

Successful searches begin with accurate search terms. It is often useful to begin a search using **broad search terms** in order to get a sense of how much the library has on a specific subject; then narrow to more specific topics, by adding:

- a **geographic area** (e.g, *Canada, Toronto, Nova Scotia*)
- a **time period** (e.g, *renaissance, 19<sup>th</sup> century, fifties*)
- another **subject(s)** (e.g. *aesthetics philosophy, marxism criticism art*)

**No Results?** Use related terms or synonyms to find additional information on all aspects of your topic:

- e.g. for **integrated media** try multi media, video, film, cinema, etc.

**Tips:**

- use the **truncation symbol \*** to get all forms of a word: canad\* for Canada, Canadian, Canadians
