

The OCAD U Course Catalogue Guide

The OCAD U Course Catalogue can be accessed online through the OCAD U website. From the homepage go to 'Current Students' and select Course Catalogue from the menu.



There are four primary ways to select a course or list of courses in the catalogue (instructions on pages 3 to 6):

On the **Subject Search** page:

1. View a specific course
2. View all of the courses in one subject area
3. View all of the courses in multiple subject areas
4. View all courses which contain a specific word or phrase in the title or description

On the **Advanced Search** page:

1. View a specific course
2. View all of the courses in one subject area
3. View all of the courses in multiple subject areas
4. View all courses which contain a specific word or phrase in the title or description

The 'Advanced Search' function offers some filters which can be used at the same time subject(s) or course(s) are selected.

Filters

All course lists can further filtered using the following criteria, displayed on the left-hand side of the page, once a subject has been selected. Multiple filters can be applied.

Through the 'Advanced Search' function some of these filters can be applied at the same time subject(s) or course(s) are selected.

- a) Enter the full course code in the upper right 'Search for courses...' field. Codes can be entered in upper or lower case or with or without the dash e.g., ENGL-1003, ENGL1003, engl1003.

2. Search for courses in a specific subject area

- a) On the 'Subject Search' page, click on a subject (discipline) in the alphabetic menu on the left to obtain a list of all courses offered in that subject area, listed in numeric order. There may be multiple pages of courses; to advance to the next page click on the arrow or next page number at the bottom of the screen.

DRPT-1004 Painting II (0.5 Credits)

Building on the skills acquired in Painting I, students explore varied approaches to painting and shape their observational and creative skills through figuration, abstraction and digital processes. Along with improving their painterly skills, students consider cultural meanings and conventions of painting. Note: It is recommended students register in the same SECTION for both DRPT 1003 and DRPT 1004 to allow for continuity. Students with credit in DRPT-1001, DRPT-1C01 may not take this course for credit.

Requisites: DRPT-1003 - Must be taken either prior to or at the same time as this course.

DRPT-1003 Painting I (0.5 Credits)

Painting I introduces students to the fundamentals of colour theory, colour mixing and colour relationships. Students progress through a series of projects that build skill acquisition along with an exposure to a diversity of contemporary painting practices. Working from observation, students will investigate materiality, colour, design, historical context and concept. Course activities carry across the Fall and Winter semesters and students must register in both Painting I and Painting II during the same academic year. Students with credit in FOUN-1B04, FOUN-1B24, GART-1004, GART-1B04, GDES-1014, GDES-1022, GDES-1031, GDES-1B16, GDES-1B24, GDES-1C02 may not take this course for credit. Note: It is recommended students register in the same SECTION for both DRPT 1003 and DRPT 1004 to allow for continuity.

4. Search for a key word or phrase

Enter the key word or a phrase (in quotation marks) in the upper right 'Search for courses...' field to view a list of all courses containing the key word or phrase in the course title and/or course description. Courses will be listed in alpha-numeric order. There may be multiple pages of courses; to advance to the next page click on the arrow or the next page number at the bottom of the screen.

Filters

Choose any combination of filters to narrow the list of courses resulting from a search. On the 'Advanced Search' page some of these filters can be selected at the same time as the subject is selected:

a. Availability

Selecting 'open sections' will result in a list of only those courses which have space available. Some of these may be in a past term and therefore not open for registration. To find courses with sections available for registration, also select the specific term (see d.)

Tip: To view all currently available sections, select a subject, select open sections and the term and then deselect the subject.

b. Subjects

Once a subject has been selected, it will display with a check mark in the 'Subjects' filter. To change subjects, uncheck the box by clicking on it and the full subject list will appear and another can be selected ('checked'). The number in brackets beside the subject indicates the number of courses offered in that subject. Subjects are listed in alphabetical order of courses offered in the academic year.

c. Locations

Courses are identified as held in Toronto, Main Campus, Independent Only, Other Location, Off-Campus, Multiple Locations or Online Only.

d. Terms

Selecting a specific term will result in a display of courses with sections offered in that term only.

e. Days of Week

This option allows selection of course sections offered on a specific day of the week; best used in conjunction with a specific term.

f. Time of Day

This option allows selection of course sections offered only in a specific time range i.e., morning, afternoon or evening.

g. Instructors

Selecting an instructor from the alphabetic list will result in a list of all of the course sections taught by that instructor in the current academic year.

h. Academic Levels

Selecting one of the two academic levels will result in a list of only 'Undergraduate' (Bachelor's) or only 'Graduate' (Master's) level courses.

i. Course Levels

Courses can be selected by year level. The first digit in the numeric part of the course code reflects the year level of the course. Undergraduate courses are numbered 1, 2, 3 or 4. Graduate level courses are numbered 5 or 6. (On recommendation of their Chair, undergraduate students in fourth year with an overall A average may receive special approval to take year 5 level graduate courses.)

j. Course Types

Course type shows 'Indigenous', 'Liberal Studies', 'Non-Studio' and 'Studio' designated courses, applicable to undergraduate graduation requirements.
