Your Program Requirements

This program guide defines the 20.0 credits required for the Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) in Printmaking & Publications, including Major requirements (specific courses and course options), Arts & Science requirements and open electives.

Of the 20.0 credits required, the following applies:

- No more than 6.0 credits may be at the 1000 level
- At least 5.0 credits must be at the 3000 level or higher, including at least 1.0 credit at the 4000 level or higher
- At least 1.5 credits of Arts & Science courses must be at the 3000 or 4000 level

Reading Your Program Guide

Course Codes

Codes begin with a four letter subject code followed by four digits. The first digit indicates the year level of the course. For example, *GRPH-2004* designates a specific *Graphic Design* course at the *2000 level*. Generally, students complete 1000 and 2000 level courses before 3000 and 4000 level courses.

Course Weight

- 0.5 credit courses typically meet three hours per week for a 12-week term.
- 1.0 credit courses typically meet six hours per week for a 12-week term.

Major Requirements - Course Options

Although a specific number of credits are required from each category, you may choose to take additional courses from these lists as open electives.

Sample 4 Year Plan & Helpful Planning Information (at the end of this package)

The program is structured so that it can be completed in four years, by a student taking 2.5 credits per term in the fall and winter terms (a limited number of courses are also offered in the spring/summer terms). The sample plan will help you plan your courses.

In addition to general planning tips and suggested pathways, the helpful planning information can include recommended courses for your program and tips on meeting prerequisites for electives you may want to take.

Senior undergraduate students in good academic standing may take graduate courses at the **5000 level** from any of the following subject areas: CADN, CRCP, DHEA, DIGF, INCD, SFIN. Inquiries regarding access to 5000 level courses should be directed to the student's Faculty Office.

Students who have completed a minimum of 4.0 credits and are in good academic standing may **declare a minor**. Only open electives and general Arts & Science courses may fulfill both degree and minor requirements, subject to the credit limits stipulated in this program guide. Helpful Planning Information – Printmaking & Publications

General Planning Tips:

- When planning your courses, keep in mind that the Specific Courses (required) focus on core concepts and broad technical steps related to printmaking and publications. Course Options support further advanced technical learning and opportunities for deeper investigation within printmaking and publications, allowing you flexibility to direct your studies.
- Pay attention to course pre-requisites and level requirements. There is a great deal
 of freedom, and you may take many 3000 level courses in second year, 4000 level
 courses in third year and reach back in fourth year to pick-up desired courses you
 have missed.
- For more information on specific courses or pathways, reach out to Printmaking & Publications faculty and/or your Program Chair.

Planning Considerations - Option Category A:

Although you are only required to take three of the 2000 level introductory courses in
 Option Category A it might be advantageous to take more of them, depending on your
 technical background and interests.

Planning Considerations - Option Category D:

The requirements in **Option Category D** for professional experience offer a range of options, allowing you to gain professional knowledge. Such experience can provide a significant head start into future opportunities.

- A Field Placement (**PRPB-3897**) is a good opportunity to get hands-on experience in an area of interest with a gallery, printmaking studio, publisher, magazine, artist/publisher or other setting of your choice. This will require personal initiative, but the *Centre for Emerging Artists and Designers* is there to assist you. You may take up to 1.5 credits of field study over years 3 and 4. This way you can plan for varied experiences.
- The courses CROS-3023 Learning in the Field I and CROS-3024 Learning in the Field II (both courses must be taken in the same academic year) provide more support and structure, but also places you in the field as an intern in the same way as a Field Placement.
- The CROS-3001 Professional Practice course provides information about the practicalities of an art career.
- If you feel unready for such external professional experience, you may take PRPB 3898 Independent Study with a faculty member, designing your own extended project.

Planning Considerations – Open Electives:

 Exploration is encouraged to support your practical and critical skills across different program areas.

- When choosing Open Electives, we recommend you consider the courses in the Option Categories (Categories A through E) as these courses are a good fit with your major. Although electives can be fulfilled from across the program, these credits will allow you to take additional Printmaking & Publications courses to address your mix of interests.
- If you take more courses than the minimum requirement to fulfill the Category, these courses will fulfill Open Electives.

Planning for Fourth/Final Year:

- Students need a minimum of 1.0 credit at the 4000 level. You can choose to fulfill this by completing Thesis courses, Advanced Printmaking & Publications courses or other 4000 level elective courses within the university. Ensure you meet this requirement when completing Arts & Science electives (in Categories I, J, or K) or Open Electives.
- In your fourth/final year you can choose to take Thesis courses (in Open Electives)
 from either Printmaking & Publications (PRPB) or Cross-Disciplinary Art (CROS):
 - PRPB-4901 Thesis 1 (Fall) and PRPB-4902 Thesis 2 (Winter). PRPB-4901 is the pre-requisite for PRPB-4902.
 - CROS-4901 Open Studio Thesis: Research (Fall) and CROS 4902 Open Studio Thesis: Presentation (Winter). CROS-4901 is the pre-requisite for CROS-4902.
- Thesis courses will allow you to concentrate on a major portfolio of work for future exhibitions, graduate school portfolios or various employment opportunities. Although you can take the PRPB-4901 or CROS-4901 without taking the subsequent course (PRPB-4902 or CROS-4902) taking both Thesis courses is highly recommended in providing a concentrated fourth year experience with your peers as you focus on your final body of work.
- If you would rather fulfill your 4000 level requirements outside of Thesis courses, you could select advanced studio courses from within Printmaking & Publications (PRPB) or another program area. This could be a good option if you want more time to focus on your skill development or round out your technical learning. Be sure to look at pre-requisites for the courses you might want to take.
- Remember that in your studio and elective credits, you may select from both 3000 and 4000 level courses at the upper year.

Planning for Specific Pathways:

• If you are interested in pursuing a particular direction within your Printmaking & Publications studies, plan your Option and Elective courses to gain the knowledge and experiences that will support you. For example, several of the PRPB courses emphasize entrepreneurial strategies. If this is of interest to you, be sure to read through course descriptions in the Course Catalogue.

- If you are intending to pursue a master's program or other field of study after OCAD University, plan to take the Thesis courses in PRPB or CROS (either PRPB-4901 and PRPB-4902, or CROS-4901 and CROS-4902).
- Ensure that you review the course description and pre-requisites for all courses so you can plan correctly from year to year.
