



## OCAD UNIVERSITY SABBATICAL LEAVE FINAL PRODUCTIVITY REPORT

Within two (2) months of the termination of your sabbatical leave, you are required to submit a Final Productivity Report composed of three components:

- A) **Public Presentation/Exhibition to the OCAD community;**
- B) **A Narrative Summary; and**
- C) **Communication Results**

### **Part A) Public Presentation or Exhibition**

At a time to be coordinated between yourself and OCAD U (appropriate committee to be identified), you will present a public (slide) lecture, for the OCAD U community, on work you accomplished during your sabbatical leave. (See OCAD U's Sabbatical Policy)

### **Part B) Narrative Summary**

Please follow these guidelines to compose your narrative research summary and affix this page to your document. The summary may be up to a maximum of five (5) pages. Please use the headings given below and provide the information requested under each. In cases where you do not have any information to report, please list the heading and type N/A (not applicable) directly underneath.

1. **Original Objectives:** State the original objectives defined in your research and describe the extent to which they were achieved.

2. Advancement of Knowledge/Practice: Describe how your research or practice contributed to the advancement of knowledge or scholarship in the theme area.

3. Practical Impact: Discuss how your research contributed to the development of professional practices and/or teaching practice (pedagogy).

4. International Aspects: Describe any international facets of your project, if applicable.

**Part C: Communication Activities**

Please report on all communications activities resulting from this grant. You may affix separate sheets to list the information required.

1. Books. (Author, Title, Publisher and Place, Date, No. of Pages)

2. Exhibitions mounted, or exhibitions organized to be mounted in the near future as a direct result of the sabbatical leave research. (Title, Venue, Dates)

3. Scholarly or popular articles or working papers. Indicate whether the journals or magazines are refereed (R) or no-refereed (NR). (Author, Title, Publisher and Place, Date, No. of Pages)

4. Scholarly conference papers. (Author, Title, Location Presented, Date)

5. Media: Include interview(s), articles and audiovisual productions. (Interviewees, Medium, Program/Publication Name, Interviewer, Location, Date)
